A couple of hours was spent with the Bryson family, for which we are grateful to them, deep in discussion about International rallying, P76s and John's new book which will be out this year. A great way to end a great day. When Richard returns to Australia for his next visit he says an Austin Kimberley and Force 7 are on his must see list. Thanks Richard and Deidre for your time. THINKING SMALL

The big news on the model front is of course that the much-anticipated P76 Deluxe has been finished and is now in our possession. And what a brilliant job our model builder, Rob Bender, has done. For those catching up on the news of the Deluxe model it is a base model V8 Deluxe with bench front seat, column shift gearbox. It of course has the correct Deluxe hubcaps and single headlight front end. The finished product would look fantastic next to your Trax Super and/or Targa.

Due to the unqualified success of the Force 7 project we increased the production run from 76 to 100 which means all the P76 clubs are automatically allocated 11 models first up. 6 from our club have already been sold so if you want one and haven't got one yet, get in quick or you may miss out. We will not be doing the Deluxe sedan again so this is your only chance. Price has remained the same at \$75 for each kit. We have been able to extend the professional



model building and painting service as with the Force 7 only the price has had to go up to \$65 for completely finished model mounted on a plinth in its own display case.

Other P76 clubs have been ordering already with WA, QLD, ACT and New Zealand clubs getting their orders in so the models are slowly flowing out the door. As per the Force 7, model number 76 will be auctioned at the Nationals at Easter. I'm sure it will be very sought after.

At this point I must thank Marty Stockwell for dipping into his personal

savings to help the club pay for all the models. We aren't that flash with cash and couldn't afford it ourselves. Thanks again Uncle Marty. Having said that we need to get the money in as quick as we can so we can give Marty his money back.

Moving on, the next big project is the wagon. The model is 95% finished but won't become available until the Deluxes are all sold. The one thing that our club can't afford is to do is run 2 projects of this size concurrently. I have seen the wagon model in production and it is as good if not better than the Force 7. I can't wait until it comes out.

The last model project on the go at the moment is the P76 Rallye, which is a code 3 from the Trax Targa. I am only getting 20 done and 10 have already been allocated. The price of these is

\$80 each plus you need to supply the donor Trax Targa. This project is not a club project but one of my own organising. I am only getting 20 decal kits made and once their gone, their gone. Don't forget; get your orders in quick.
