This year is the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Targa Florio model brought out by Leyland after the success of the P76 winning 1<sup>st</sup> placing on the Targa Florio circuit of the World Cup Rally which started in London May 5 1974.

It was a limited Sports Pack model available on the super V8 with floor auto transmission level. A run of approx 600 most of which were factory painted in Omega Navy with silver striping, limited slip diff, laminated windscreen, power steering, mag wheels, radio with rear speaker and power aerial and air conditioning as an optional extra. Dealer optioned vehicles were painted in Nutmeg and Aspen Green. These were metallic colours of blue, brown and green

## PRESIDENT'S RAMBLINGS

Well, the weather is cooling off now and we get into autumn and the Club is going into winter hibernation and we are packing up the caravan and heading somewhere warmer. Heading for Eyre Peninsular initially but if it gets too cold, we'll head north to some spot on the map that we haven't been before.

I've spent spare time in the shed attending to details of the motorbike restoration which is getting close to its final stages although I won't put fuel in it till we get back in October. After pulling down the carbies after the bike sitting idle (not idling) for 10+ years and finding them full of gummy crap from old fuel, some jets I couldn't even unblock, had to replace with new. I don't want to have to do that again. It has been an interesting exercise, the bike being of 1976 vintage but have been able to purchase most parts required i.e. gaskets, carbie seal kits, brake caliper pistons and seals and other bits to give us (Di will tell you it is her bike) a good-looking machine. My metal polishing skills got a good work out with plenty of aluminum, chrome and stainless steel now looking pretty schmick. Photos when it is finished.

Prior to the Club camping weekend at Port Broughton, I had purchased some LED H7 low beam globes for the Isuzu, as I frequently have blown halogen globes, probably 1 or 2 a year, possibly from vibration of the bull bar? Anyway, as the LEDs do not have an element they may last longer. I fitted them and checked that they worked but only in the carport and not when it was really dark. However when driving back to Port Broughton from Wallaroo on the Saturday night, first time actually using them at night, I discovered only a white glow in front of the car. My daytime running lights were brighter than this. I gave John a bit of distance ahead of me and was able to actually see the road with high beams. I pulled them out when we got home after the weekend and did some comparison to the halogen globe I had removed previously and found the distance from the flange to the element on the 2 globes were different resulting in the focal point of the LED globes being in the wrong spot for the reflectors in my lights. Lucky I didn't pay top dollar for them but they weren't the cheapest either. Looking more closely at item descriptions on the internet sales shows some address this dimension where others do not. Hope this helps others contemplating an LED upgrade. I haven't bought another set yet and will continue with the halogens for now. Stay tuned.

Some of our members have been on the sick list of late but are now recovering, best healthy wishes to Vittoria, Sandie and Chris as you get back to full health after your recent setbacks.

## Update on the Code of Practice

Dear Club Secretary,

The following correspondence is taken from an email received from Executive Director Transport Policy and Regulation of the Dept of Infrastructure and Transport.

"I am writing to notify you of recent changes made to the Code of Practice (the Code) for the Conditional Registration Scheme for Historic, Left-Hand Drive and Street Rod Vehicles (the Scheme).

As part of the 2022 South Australian State Election, the Malinauskas Labor Government committed to consulting with Car Clubs about the inclusion of Individually Constructed Vehicles (ICVs) into the Scheme. As you are aware, between November 2022 and January 2023, the Department for Infrastructure and Transport (the Department) undertook this consultation.

In reviewing the feedback provided by participating Clubs, the inclusion of ICVs into the Scheme was supported. ICVs are now eligible for conditional registration under the Scheme. To implement the change, amendments to the Motor Vehicles Regulations 2010 were proclaimed on 16 November 2023.

As a result of the change, the Code has been amended to reflect the inclusion of ICVs into the Scheme. Additionally, further amendments to the Code have been made to address feedback previously provided by the Federations and recognised Clubs under the Scheme.

#### **Changes to the Code of Practice**

A summary of the changes made to the Code is outlined below:

- The Scheme will now be known as "The Conditional Registration Scheme for Historic, Left-Hand Drive, Street Rod and Individually Constructed Vehicles".
- The format of the Code has been updated to reflect the Department's new branding.
- The Forward has been updated in line with the introduction of ICVs into the Scheme.
- Three new clauses have been introduced (1.10, 1.11 and 1.12) to provide a clear definition and eligibility requirements for ICVs in the Scheme.
- MR334 booklets will now be issued to a Club and not an individual authorised person, allowing any authorised person to complete any MR334 form issued to the club.

- Clause 2.13 has been amended to remove the requirement for MR334 booklets to be returned if the appointment of the authorised person is revoked.
- Clause 2.22 has been amended to state that an elected official or authorised person is responsible for keeping MR334 booklets.
- The definition of a financial member is now included in the Code. This was included to address several enquiries the Department had received from Clubs attempting to determine whether a member was considered a financial member and therefore eligible for registration under the Scheme.
- Clause 2.30 has been amended to no longer require Clubs to forward copies of logbook annual return sheets to the issuing body. Instead, a report can be provided.
- Clause 3.6 has been amended to remove confusion as to who is required to sign the logbook prior to each day's journey. The last sentence of the clause has been removed to avoid any doubt as to who makes the record and signs the book.
- Clause 4.3 has been amended to change the word 'may' to 'shall'. This clause previously indicated there was no compulsion to obtain a logbook approved by the Registrar from the issuing body. (This and the above two are from requests made by the FHMCSA).
- Clause 2.14 has been corrected. Previously, this clause referred to a requirement under clause 2.7, however it should have referred to clause 2.8.
- Wording has been added to clause 4.12 following an identified inconsistency with the Registrar's existing policy for vehicle inspection requirements."

An updated Code is available on the SA Government web-site, and also available from our web-site at [www.fhmcsa.org.au](http://www.fhmcsa.org.au)

The enclosed Code of Practice is dated 11 January 2024 and the Federation decided that a printed copy would be distributed to all affiliated clubs as soon as it became available from the Registrar.

Clubs are asked to keep their Committees and Members aware of their responsibilities as outlined in the Code. This can be adequately done by reprinting the applicable sections of the Code in your respective magazines.

A further printed copy will be available to attending Club Representatives at the meeting scheduled for 2pm on Saturday 10 February 2024.
